to have/has + Grundform+ -ed

Beispiel: *I/you/we/they have loved he/she/it has loved*

Anwendung:

Unregelmässige Verben:

to have/has + 3. Verbform

Beispiel: *I/you/we/they have written he/she/it has written*

Das **Present Perfect Simple** drückt aus, dass eine Handlung vor kurzem stattfand und noch Einfluss auf die Gegenwart hat.

Beispiel: *She has cooked dinner. It's on the table now.*


